On Thursday the first week we were in the village of Lopez. Around mid-morning a pregnant young lady came into the clinic carrying a baby.

She was at Roberts medical station. The Mom was 6 mons. preg. The baby is Downs Syn. looking like a 7 month old but is 1 1/2 years old and very malnourished. Mom told us she also has 2 more children at home. Her husband was killed 2 mons. ago. That's when we all cried. I really cried when holding the baby. Yes, your right, I wanted to bring the baby home!!!!!!!!!!!!!! The team took up a collection for her family, and the church will also be helping her. The team gathered around her for prayer.

Then on Thursday the second week, were so bad the team was in JAIL..... treating 350 inmates. Actually we were the first medical team that ever helped the inmates.

In several villages we were the first medical team to help them. We felt so blessed for God leading us to San Pedro Sula. The team feels so privileged to have treated 5125 people in 2 weeks. The 4 dentists treated 500 patients, and we gave out all 1400 pairs of eye glasses. PTL
